English - Reading

This term, we are reading the novel: Romans on Rampage by Jeremy Strong.

In reading lessons, children will continue to develop their skills with retrieval and inference. They will read a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts.

Parents can help at home by reading with their child and signing their reading record every day.

English - Writing

Writing to inform – we will create our newspaper article based on the events of Romans on a Rampage. We will continue to focus on writing for different purposes.

Writing to inform – we will write a report on climate zones.

Grammar

We will continue to build on and expand upon the children's knowledge of grammar, looking especially this term at:

- Inverted commas
- Paragraphs

Mathematics

This half term we will cover the following topics:

- Multiplication and Division
- Addition and Subtraction

Please support your child by completing set homework in their CGP book and logging into Mathletics each week.

Science - How do animals and humans move?

We will be learning how to identify and describe the function of some parts of the human skeleton. We will also classify animals according to their skeleton and identify and describe the function of muscles in the human arm.

We will visit the Science Museum to learn more about the human skeleton.

Punjabi – Pupils will have a Punjabi lesson every week which is taught by a specialist teacher. Please help them to learn more by speaking, reading and Punjabi at home.

This term, pupils will focus on netball and gymnastics. Please ensure that the have the correct kit with them every week

Sikh Studies - Who wrote the Sikh National Anthem (Deh Shiva) and why is it important?

By the end of this term, children will be able to describe the importance of the following:

- · Learn the shabad and recite it yourself.
- Children write their own verse of Deh Shiva Bar Mohe and reflect on what it means to them.

Geography- What are the differences between the climate zones in the USA?

We will be learning how to use a maps and atlases to identify the continent and countries of North America. We will also locate and describe the climate zones of

the USA.



Religious Education - Why is the Bible important to Christians?

Reflecting on the importance of the Guru Granth Sahib Ji in the Sikh faith we will learn about the importance of the Bible for Christians.

We will visit St Mary's Church and meet Reverend Ann.

Computing - How can we keep safe online?

Children will continue to discuss key online safety rules and how we can keep safe online. We will learn how to send emails to each other.

We encourage parents to ensure they have parent controls on their internet.

PSHE - How to prevent bullying?



Reflecting on times people have been unkind, including themselves we will link the 5 virtues and vices to their own lives and behavior and learn how to stop bulling.

Art – How do mosaics create images from small blocks?

Following on from our exciting History unit on the Romans we will look observe and respond to mosaic art and discuss why mosaics are used.
